MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS

Using your own recycled materials at home, create your own musical instrument together.

You can use your AAC to select the instrument you want to create and use your best yes/no to select the materials you want to use to make it.

Consider what my best access method would be, it may be expending my fingers or kicking my feet to play the instrument.

The whole family could get involved and you can start your own band!

Extension: Use the alphabet page in your PODD book or your preferred communication device to name your band!









Choose something in nature that you can hear eg. the wind, water, birds. For a week keep an ear out for your chosen sound. Listen for how its sound changes. Wonder why. Find new ways to describe what you are hearing.

Make audio recordings. How can you capture your 'soundmaker' in a photo or on film?

For example, if you choose the rain– Go out and listen to as many sounds created by rain as possible. Listen for lowpitched and high-pitched ones, for those which continually change their pitch and their loudness. Rain falling on the dry ground, rain falling on glass, on tin, rain running off the roof.

Use your AAC devices to discuss how the sounds make you feel, what your opinion is of the sound and what you think it sounds like.









Making your own perfume or aftershave can be a lovely sensory experience for you to do together.

Enjoy a stroll out and collect some flowers. Your child can feel and smell the flowers while you talk about what they are called, what colours they are and what you like/dislike about them using your PODD book or other communication devices.

Follow the instructions in the QR code below and consider your child's best access methods to be involved as possible in making the perfume.

Use the alphabet page in the PODD book to give the perfume you have created a name.

Have a go at writing some items that you want on your weekly shopping list together.

Auditory scan the letters on the alphabet page of your child's PODD book or encourage them to use their preferred AAC device. As you scan, watch for their reactions to the letters. If they give a positive response (looking at you, vocalising, pointing to their book etc) then affirm that they would like to use that letter. Write down the letters that your child provides you and attribute meaning to what they might want to add to the shopping list.

For example, if you have the letters 'c, a and e' this could mean chocolate or cake or something else.

Music Through the Decades



The way we can listen to, and access music has changed vastly through the decades. In class, we are learning all about the different devices we can use/have used to listen to music. A fun and engaging way to explore these is through arts and crafts!

Remember you can use your PODD book or other AAC devices to name songs, choose colours, construct your name, select materials etc.

This would also be a great opportunity to explore different music devices that you may have at home such as record players, iPods, Alexa, cassette tapes etc.








This term we will be reading some new and exciting texts from a website called 'Oxford Owl'.
